Students who complete Communication Studies 240 may not count Communication Studies 210 toward the major. Communication Studies 445 may not be counted toward the major. A total of no more than three hours each of Communication Studies 491 and 493 may be counted toward the major.

⁸College Electives are three courses (nine hours) from Advertising, Information Sciences, Journalism and Electronic Media, or Public Relations. These courses must come from at least two different areas of study.

⁹Arts and Sciences Electives are four courses (12 hours) to be taken from the following programs: African and African-American Studies, American Studies, Anthropology, Art History, Cinema Studies, Classics, Economics, English, French, Geography, German, History, Italian, Musicology, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Religious Studies, Russian, Sociology, Spanish, Theatre, and Women's Studies. Six hours of these courses must be at the 300 or 400 level.
